Salt-tolerant Trees & Shrubs

Red Alder (*Alnus rubra*)
Serviceberry (*Amelanchier alnifolia*)
Pacific Madrone (*Arbutus menziesii*)
Ocean Spray (*Holodiscus discolor*)
Black Twinberry (*Lonicera involucrata*)
Tall Oregon-Grape (*Mahonia (Berberis) aquifolium*)
Pacific Crabapple (*Malus fusca*)
Wax Myrtle (*Myrica californica* & *M. gale*)
Sitka Spruce (*Picea sitchensis*)
Shore Pine (*Pinus contorta v. contorta*)
Nootka Rose (*Rosa nutkana*)
Clustered Wild Rose (*Rosa pisocarpa*)
Thimbleberry (*Rubus parviflorus*)
Trailing Blackberry (*Rubus ursinus*)
Scouler Willow (*Salix scouleriana*)
